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Year R/1 - Phoenix

Wow! What a great start to Summer term Phoenix class have had! It's certainly been a busy two weeks. We started the term with a trip to Holdenby House where the children became tree explorers for the day. It was a lovely day and the children were a credit to the school! They came back to school very excited to continue their learning of plants and flowers. Year 1 also took part in their phonic screening test last week. The children have worked so hard with their phonics and they have certainly made me very proud of their achievements! The Reception children have also been busy looking at instruction writing in English. They are working hard to write a set of instructions on how to grow a beanstalk. In Math's, Reception have been super mathematicians exploring subtraction and Year one has been looking at position. In Science, the children have all planted their own bean and will explore the beanstalks changes over the next few weeks.

Year 2 - Dragon

What a great start to the final half term of Year 2, Dragon class! In Math's, we have been working really hard with position and direction - particularly those tricky quarter and half turns! We are also starting to focus on time and using our clocks to help us! In English, we are creating our non-chronological report about pirates, really thinking about the layout and structure as well as the facts we have learnt! In Reading, we are extending our predicting and vocabulary skills as we look at a variety of plant non-fiction texts. In Science, we are continuing with our plants topic and have been making scientific drawings of our bulbs and beans that we planted 8 weeks ago. They are rather large now and have beans growing on them too! In History we are looking at our next explorer, Neil Armstrong. This week, we have been exploring the events of the space race in the 1960s! In RE, we are exploring sacred places for believers in different religions. We are starting with our Church and exploring key areas and artefacts within the Church that are important to believers. Well done Dragon class!

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Year 3/4 - Centaur

Centaur class have returned from half term with gusto! We have started our new Geography topic on Rivers, and have been researching some major rivers of the UK, their lengths, where the source is, and some major towns and cities they pass through. We have also been immersing ourselves in some new vocabulary linked to this topic. In English, we have begun work on our next unit which is "The River" by the poet Valerie Bloom. We have learned all about rhyme structure of poetry and been working hard on creating metaphors to add imagery to our writing. In Science, we have started our new unit of work on "Sound", and taken part in several practical experiments to find out what we might already know. We have been on a sound walk around Loddington to identify different sources of sound in the environment - some of the sounds we heard were very surprising! Well done Centaur class!!



Year 5/6 - Griffin

Over the last week in Griffin class, the children have started their biographies about David Attenborough. We have watched clips from biographies and interviews in order to gain a better understanding of who he is and what he has achieved. As part of our Evolution topic in Science, this week the children have completed an investigation looking at birds' beaks. The children used different sized tweezers and spoons to find out how many raisins could be picked up in 10 seconds. Reflecting on this, they thought about which type of beaks would increase chances of survival. In RE, the children have been learning about Salvation and they have looked in depth at the events leading to Jesus' death. They each chose a scene to recreate through their own artwork, these were fantastic! Last Friday, all of Griffin class went swimming, this will continue for the remainder of the term. Mrs Poyner and Mr Umney said that all the children worked incredibly hard and had great fun at the same time!

Dear Lord, please will you give peace and perseverance to everyone. Thank you for our homes and health and thank you for making me, me! Amen.


Dear Lord, please will you help us have honesty. I am sorry for all of the people who lie. Thank you for this wonderful world. Amen
