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

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LEARNING AND FLOURISHING TOGETHER

Year R/1 - Phoenix

R/1 have had a wonderful start to this half term. We had a very exciting delivery of class caterpillars which the children have loved. They are fascinated to see the changes and learn about a caterpillar life cycle. In English, the Reception children have been busy writing a caterpillar diary and Year 1 are working hard on their poetry unit. In Maths, Reception have been exploring teen numbers and have wowed me with their skills. Year 1 have been busy working on numbers to 50 and exploring one more / one less and addition and subtraction. In Science, the children are learning about animal groups and we have an exciting trip to Hamerton zoo in a few weeks to immerse them further with this learning. In Geography, the children have started to learn about the UK and have located land and sea on a globe. Keep up the great work R/1. 😊



Year 2 - Dragon

Year 2 have been super busy so far this half term! In Science we have been learning about plants. We have observed the growth of the bulbs that we planted in Autumn and were very excited to see how they bloomed. We learned about the stages of bulb growth and investigated the difference between seeds and bulbs. After the bank holiday, we will be testing which conditions allow cress seeds to germinate best. Mrs Wilcoxson has been planting sunflowers with children across the school and Year 2 have enjoyed observing their growth on a weekly basis and measuring them for their growth diaries. In History, we have been learning about Christopher Columbus. To learn about his early life, we became sailors and had to sail around the playground with our maps to find clues about his life. Year 2 really enjoyed taking it in turns to be captain! In English, we are in the process of writing our hot write poems about being in charge. Some are writing about being in charge of the universe, the school and even the adults! In Maths, we are almost finished our fractions unit and have been learning about halves, guarters, thirds, two guarters and 3 guarters. We are looking forward to moving on to our next unit which is time. Keep up the super work Year 2. 😊

Year 3/4 - Centaur

In English, we have been busy working on persuasive writing. We have been learning about the Geography of Sicily, building descriptive and persuasive sentences for a holiday brochure. We have worked on many writing techniques, including similes, metaphors and symbolism. Next week, we will be applying our learning to create an independent persuasive piece of writing about London or somewhere we've been to visit. In Science, we have begun our work on Rocks and Soils, been on a walk to observe rocks in our local environment and have grouped rocks according to their appearance. We have also learned about how rocks are formed and how they can be grouped based on whether they are sedimentary, igneous or metamorphic. In History, we have enjoyed our work on the Stone Age. Year 3 have learned about the chronology of the Stone Age and how primary sources of evidence can tell us how people lived in the past and we have created some super cave paintings linked to this! Year 4 have been working on their historical enquiry - some super projects to follow in the next few weeks! Finally, we have welcomed a Hindu visitor into school today to deliver a Hindu workshop. The children have made me so proud with how they have developed questioning and enguiry linked to this topic. Thank you for all the support with times tables practice - not long now until the statutory assessment for Year 4. The children have worked so hard with this - Year 3 too! Keep practising! Year 5/6 - Griffin

Over the last few weeks in Year 5/6, the children have been working incredibly hard in preparation for the upcoming SATs. To support the children, we have been working through past papers to revise key knowledge and practise skills. In Maths, the Year 6 children have finished their unit on shape and have been learning about a 4-quadrant grid. They have been learning how to read and plot co-ordinates on these grids, as well as, translating and reflecting shapes across the four guadrants. Last week, the children had a special visitor from the Explorer Academy as part of their Amazin Rainforest topic. Simon shared his expertise and footage he had a gathered from his expeditions, the children had a fantastic day and have remembered so much from his visit. In Science, the children have been finishing their unit all bout Properties of materials. Last week, the children investigated which material proved to be the best thermal insulator; they have finished this unit by learning about reversible and irreversible changes. LODDFEST BAKE OFF 2024

The Bake Off will again be forming part of Loddfest 2024 on 22nd June 2024 in the village of Loddington. This is a fun family event and therefore the more entries the better. Entry is not limited to residents of Loddington, so entries from the surrounding areas will be welcome.

A supervised baking session is being arranged for children at Loddington Primary School on the afternoon of Friday 21st June 2024. The session will be in two parts and each will last approximately 45 minutes and a letter with more details will be sent shortly.

- Children 4 to 7 years This will comprise decorating premade cupcakes based on a selection of simple designs to be discussed with the children on the day.
- Children 8 to 11 years This will comprise decorating premade cupcakes based on designs to be discussed with the children on the day. There will also be a demonstration showing how the cakes are made and baked.

Each session will have to be limited to 36 children.

If possible, parents are asked to provide their child/children with an apron. Parents will be asked to make a financial donation towards the ingredients and sundries such as bun cases.

If parents are then happy for their child's work to be submitted for the Bake Off, their entries will be left in the village hall in sealed containers overnight and then submitted by the organisers on behalf of the children on the day at the St Leonards Church in Loddington at 12 noon on the 22nd June 2024, with judging at 1pm.

There will be prizes for each category.

As this is a charity fundraising event competitors will be asked if they would be willing to donate their entries to the Loddfest where they would be sold in the afternoon with teas and coffees to contribute towards the fundraising.
